Prefix Power

Prefixes are special word parts that you can add to the beginning of a word to change its meaning. For example, when we add *re*- to *read*, it becomes *reread*, which means *reading again*. Understanding **prefixes** helps you understand longer words better!

New and Interesting Words

Unknown words can feel a little confusing at first, but don't worry! With practice, you can become a vocabulary expert!

chaos (p. 1) If someone or something creates **chaos**, they mess things up or make people confused. Mia's cat creates **chaos** when she rushes around the kitchen and knocks things over. Mia doesn't know what she'll get up to next. Draw a picture of what **chaos** would look like.



excitedly (p. 1) If you are **excited**, you are very happy and cannot relax, as you are thinking about something good that is going to happen. Mia's cat **excitedly** races around the kitchen, looking to have fun with different objects. Can you think about a time you felt **excited** about something?

mayhem (title, p. 2) **Mayhem** describes a situation that is out of control. Mia and her cat cause **mayhem** when they get peanut butter and honey all over the kitchen while making lunch. Write a sentence with the word **mayhem**.

curious (p. 4) If you are curious about something, you are interested in it and want to know more about it. Chaos the cat is curious to learn about everything around her. Her curiosity to know what is inside the packets of food creates a mess in the kitchen. What is something you are curious about?
