

Caregivers,

If you can access school-type glue, outline the map with a fine glue line, letting it dry to form a raised edge. As you explore each location, mark it with a glue dot to pinpoint its spot in the state.



Explore New Words

- <u>direction</u> (di-REK-shun): A <u>direction</u> tells someone where to go or turn. If you are using a map facing north and are directed to point west, you point to the left. That's the <u>direction</u> the sun sets each evening.
- <u>location</u> (lo-KAY-shun): A <u>location</u> is the place where something happens or is found. Orlando is <u>located</u> in the middle of Florida. Where in Florida is your home <u>located</u>?

North, South, East, and West Florida

Florida is a long state. It takes twelve hours to drive from the top all the way to the bottom!

North Florida

Jacksonville is a city near the top of the state. That direction is called **north**. If you run your finger along the top part of the map of Florida, that is the north part of the state.

South Florida

Now run your fingers along the bottom of the map of Florida. That's where the city of Homestead is, all the way down low on the map. That direction is called <u>south</u>.

West Florida

Clearwater is a beautiful city located on the left side of the map, like your heart is on the left side of your body. That direction is <u>west</u>.

East Florida

The city of Titusville is located on the right side of the map, close to the Atlantic Ocean. That direction is <u>east</u>.

October

Sarasota

Fun Place: Myakka River State Park

Fun Fact: There's a sinkhole in the river called Deep Hole that's 300 feet wide and 130 feet deep. It's a well-known spot where alligators huddle in very large numbers every day. Beware!

Clewiston

Fun Place: Big Cypress Seminole Indian Reservation **Fun Fact:** It's a really huge place—almost twice as large as Disney World!



Big Cypress is home to 600 people from the Seminole Tribe and the Ah-Tah-Thi-Ki Museum. Its mile-long boardwalk takes you on a winding journey through the Everglades. Write, say, or show what you might smell, hear, touch, and imagine tasting on this adventure.

Smell: Take a deep sniff. What do you smell?

Hear: Shh! Listen carefully. Is that a bird singing or leaves rustling in the breeze? You decide, and say what it is!

Touch: Think about holding a feather in one hand and a leaf in the other. What do you notice about how they feel?

Taste: Pretend you're a bear trying to find juicy berries. What do the berries taste like?

Imagine: How do you feel as you wander on the boardwalk, exploring Big Cypress?

Brace yourself! Your sense of smell is in for a sensory surprise at your next stop!

Naples

Fun Place: Naples Botanical Garden **Fun Fact:** Some plant species at the Botanical Garden are so old that they lived during the time of the dinosaurs. Imagine that! Real-life dinosaur plants!

February


Fort Lauderdale


